Unauditable Governments in Washington

Progress since May 2019

What is the law?

State law (RCW 43.09.260) requires local governments to be audited by our Office and for them to submit annual financial reports (RCW 43.09.230), yet every year many governments do not meet these obligations.

If auditors cannot obtain adequate information to perform an audit for 3 years, our Office notifies the public.







Government declared "unauditable"

41 governments were identified as unauditable from 2015 through 2017



What is their status now?

3 governments formerly identified as unauditable have received completed audits and are no longer unauditable.

38 governments are currently listed as unauditable.

A government is unauditable if it has not provided adequate financial records for SAO to perform an audit. 15 of the governments below, often with the help of neighboring governments such as cities and counties, have worked with our Office and are being audited or have filed information for audit. However, those governments are still considered unauditable until an audit is completed.



This issue isn't limited to a specific area of the state. The map below shows the distribution of the 38 remaining unauditable governments.








What are they?

SAO continues outreach and action

The two governments that have received a Report on Unauditable Government, King County Drainage District No. 5 and Skagit County Dike District No. 19, have been referred to the state Attorney General's Office for possible legal action.

We continue to work with governments that have not been audited.

"The good news is most governments do the right thing by providing their financial information and being audited regularly. However, there is a small group that has not met their legal requirements to be transparent and accountable, and it is my goal to bring every one of those governments into compliance," said State Auditor Pat McCarthy.

What you can do

Local governments and citizens can encourage unauditable governments to return to compliance with state law. Many of the leaders of these small governments are responsive to both the people they serve and to neighboring governments. A call, a letter or a conversation can make a difference.
