In response, our office does not have personal tax records of citizens. Our audits look at financial information and compliance with state, federal and local laws on the part of all local governments, including schools, and all state agencies, including institutions of higher education. In addition, we:

- Perform special investigations of fraud and whistleblower cases and referrals from our Citizen Hotline.
- Conduct performance audits of state agencies and local governments.
- Produce several annual reports addressing state, local and internal matters.
- Take our role as partners in accountability seriously. We provide training and technical assistance to government organizations and have an extensive program to coordinate audit efficiency and to ensure high-quality audits.
